A record number of more than 100 children, teens, parents and volunteers participated in the annual autumn Willow House Family Camp. Held from September 9th-11th at the beautiful Williams Bay campus of Aurora University in Wisconsin, the camp was co-sponsored by the Darrell Pollack DP9 Foundation and included twenty-five families. The camp served as a comforting experience for those profoundly affected by the deaths of their moms, dads, sisters and brothers.

The theme of this year's camp was "Branching Out," which encouraged the participants to find different ways of reaching out and supporting one another during the challenging days of grief.

While the families enjoyed many fun activities, they also engaged in poignant and meaningful activities that provided opportunities to share stories, feelings, and commemorate their loved ones in a safe and nurturing environment.

One particularly powerful activity was the "Empty Chair" project. The chair was a physical reminder of the empty space left by their loved one's death. Each child and teen was given a wooden chair to decorate with photos, clothing and other special objects brought from home that reminded them of their family member.

These beautiful "empty" chairs were brought home and will provide the children with a very personal memorial.



Other weekend activities included team-building games, tie-dye, a take-off on "The Amazing Race", and a campfire complete with s'mores, and movies. The weekend provided an opportunity for adults and families to connect with each other, openly discuss their grief, and to spend time as a family in a beautiful setting.
